Capital	Reflection Question	Examples in your life or work
Aspirational  Ability to maintain hopes, dreams and goals with resilience.	How are we supporting the maintenance and growth of immigrants' aspirations?  What assumptions do we have about immigrants' aspirations?	
Navigational  Ability to navigate resiliently through systems with barriers.	How do we help immigrants navigate our institutions?  How willing are we to acknowledge that our institutions, both their structures and cultures, have a history of, and may still in many ways be unsupportive and/or hostile to immigrants and their communities?	
Familial  Ability to use and have social and personal human resources.	How do we recognize and help immigrants draw on wisdom, values and stories from their home communities?  How do we create environments that honor and invite families to participate?	

Linguistic	How are we supporting the language and communication strengths of immigrants?	
Ability to use multiple languages and communication styles for listening and sharing.	To what degree does our service utilize inclusive linguistic practices?	
Resistance  Ability to actively resist and survive attacks on their humanity. The knowledge, attitudes and beliefs that strive to interrupt and dismantle systems of oppression.	How do we support immigrants who are committed to engaging in and serving their home communities (however they define these)?  What opportunities do we provide immigrants in and outside of our work/clinical spaces to prepare them for participation in a diverse democracy?	
Social  Network of peers and social contacts that are committed to sharing information, community resources, emotional support and guidance.	How do we help immigrants stay connected to the communities and individuals instrumental in their success?  How do we engage with immigrants and community-based organizations about services and the types of supports immigrants need?
